Development and promotion of clusters - *increasingly* become instrumental and accepted part of enterprise policy

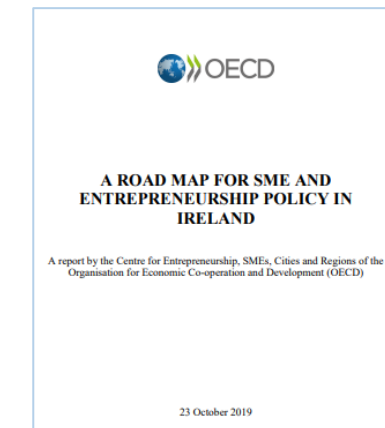

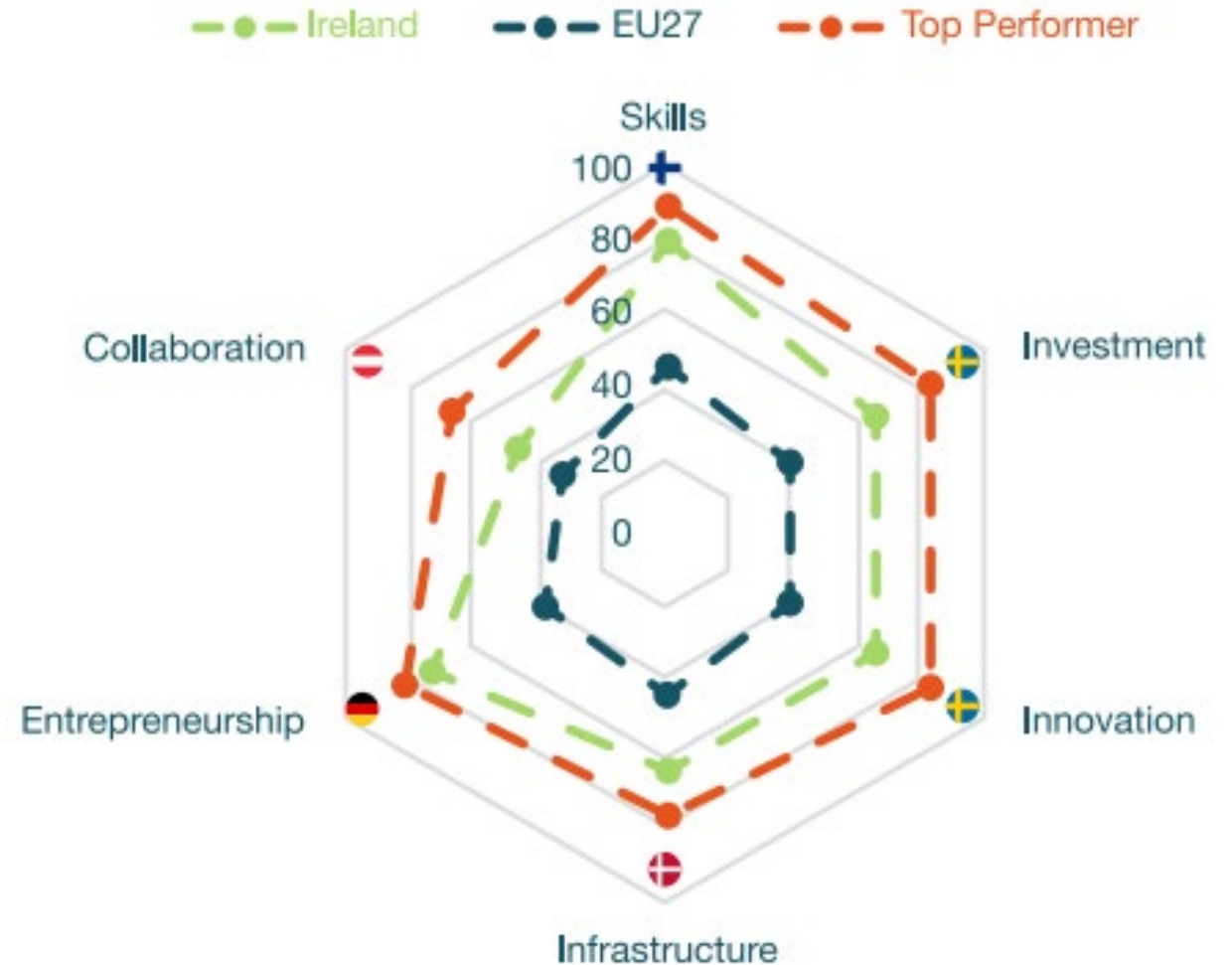


Figure 1: Enabling conditions for Advanced Technologies for Industry; Ireland, EU average and top performing country, 2020

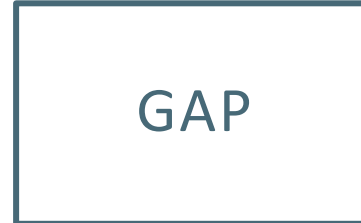

RECOMMENDATIONS
1 & 2

MOVING TO CLARITY

Cluster as a concept remains confusing - lacks an agreed definition. This is likely to continue **without** Departmental leadership across the island driving ahead with cluster goals, programmes and criteria.

RECOMMENDATION #1

Leadership and buy in is required at national government level if a clustering programme of substance, aligned with international best practice, is to be formalised to drive competitiveness in key areas of national importance across the island.

RECOMMENDATION #2

Agree appropriate definitions for Cluster, Cluster Organisations and Cluster Initiatives to be applied in the development of policy, programmes and infrastructure across the island of Ireland and differentiate them clearly from alternatives.

3 & 4

POLICY

Take account of

- life cycles of clusters,
- include both mature and nascent industries,
- the scale (geography and resources) at which clusters best operate

understanding that the trust and collaborative relationships upon which clusters thrive take a **longer-term** timescale to develop.

RECOMMENDATION #3

Develop a Cluster Policy which includes programmes with appropriate time scales and cycles.

RECOMMENDATION #4

Establish Centralised Cluster Financing Programmes based on Key Performance Indicators relevant to the cluster focus aligned with strategic priorities.

Support development of a professionalised cadre of cluster managers as a pre-requisite for the success of any cluster policy. This requires an appropriate support infrastructure.

RECOMMENDATION #5

Provision of professional and accredited Training, Education and Career Progression Opportunities for Cluster Managers and practitioners operating within cluster ecosystems.

RECOMMENDATION #6

Develop a centralised hub to connect and inform clusters across the island of Ireland and promote them nationally and internationally.
