60% of Roma children do not have access to quality services

Roma children do not have access to these facilities near their homes



72% to libraries



83% to theatre

RESPONSIVE PARENTING

Care

100% of mothers are the main caregivers of children in their family

50% of mothers do not get enough support from other family members
