





## Fits in EU trend to get local Government more involved

**1987** European Single Act: specific responsibility EU for regional policy

**1989** First regulation Structural Funds

**1992** Maastricht Treaty:

- Acknowledgement importance local and regional authorities for EU policy
- Creation of Committee of the Regions


**2007** Lisbon Treaty:

- Acknowledgement autonomy of local and regional authorities
- Subsidiarity principle also applies to local and regional authorities

## Pact of Amsterdam: Launching the EU Urban Agenda


- Operational Framework

- New form of multi-level cooperation between stakeholders.






# Thematic Partnerships

- Focus on priority themes
- Concrete, case based approach -> result oriented
- Membership: cities, member states, EC, other stakeholders
- NL will facilitate first 4 partnerships
- Formulation of proposals for better regulation, better access to funding, better knowledge exchange



# Themes of the EU Urban Agenda

# Setting up Partnerships

- Urban areas are nominated by:
  - CEMR
  - Eurocities
  - Urbact
  - CoR
- Member States are selected via the Urban Development Group
- European Commission (DG Regio coordinates)
- The Partnership may invite other relevant stakeholders to join



# Partnership 1- Housing

**Coordinated by Slovakia**



The objectives are to have affordable housing of good quality. The focus will be on public affordable housing, state aid rules and general housing policy.

## **Partners**

- \* Urban areas: Vienna, Scottish City Alliance, Riga and possibly Finish cities
- \* MS: Slovakia, Slovenia, Latvia, Luxembourg, Germany, Netherlands
- \* Others: European Commission (DG Regio and DG Energy), Housing Europe, Aedes, Eurocities, European Investment Bank & International Tenants Association



# Partnership 2 Air Quality



## Coordinated by the Netherlands

The objective is to realise systems and policies to ensure a good air quality for human health. This will cover: legislative and technical aspects linked to a wide range of polluting sources such as cars, industries, agricultural activities, etc.

## Partners

- \* Urban areas: London (UK), Helsinki (FI), Utrecht (NL), a city from Romania
- \* MS: Netherlands, Germany, possibly France and Portugal
- \* Others: European Commission (DG Regio, DG ENVI, DG Research, DG Move & DG Grow) & Eurocities



# Partnership 3 Urban Poverty

**Coordinated by France and Belgium**



The objectives are to reduce poverty and improve the inclusion of people in poverty or at risk of poverty in deprived neighbourhoods. The focus will be on: spatial concentration of structural poverty in deprived neighbourhoods (and regeneration of these areas) and child poverty.

## **Partners**

\* Urban areas: Lille (F), Kortrijk (B), Birmingham (UK), Daugavpils (LV), Patras (GR), Timisoara (RO)

\* MS: France, Belgium, Germany, Spain, Greece

\* Others: European Commission (DG Regio & DG EMPL), Regions of Brussels (B) & Ile de France (FR) & Urbact and probably European Anti-Poverty Network



## Partnership 4: Inclusion of Migrants and Refugees



### Coordinated by the city of Amsterdam


The objectives are to manage the integration of incoming migrants and refugees (extra-EU) and to provide a framework for their inclusion. This will cover: housing, integration, provision of public services, social inclusion, education and labour market measures.

### Partners

\* Urban areas: Amsterdam, Lander Berlin, Leipzig, Barcelona (Metropolitan Area)


\* MS: Greece and possibly Germany and Italy

\* Others: European Commission (DG Regio, DG Home, DG EMPL), Eurocities & CEMR



# Towards the Pact of Amsterdam

- Consultation with 38 different parties concerned
  
- Preparatory meetings (March-May 2016)
  
- 30 May 2016:
  - Informal ministerial meeting
  - City Makers Summit
  - Forum on the EU Urban Agenda
  
- 21 June:
  - Council Conclusions

- To involve urban areas in preparation and implementation of EU policy making (paragraph 3)






# Similarities with EMA 2015 Declaration

- Organise new EMA Forum in Turin 2016 (Paragraph 10)







